

Adverbs

Type of Adverb	Definition	Common Adverbs	Examples
Adverbs of Manner	Describe <i>how</i> an action is performed.	quickly, slowly, carefully, beautifully	She danced <i>beautifully</i> . / He speaks <i>clearly</i> .
Adverbs of Time	Indicate <i>when</i> an action occurs.	now, later, yesterday, soon, today	We will leave <i>soon</i> . / I visited him <i>yesterday</i> .
Adverbs of Place	Indicate <i>where</i> an action occurs.	here, there, everywhere, outside, nearby	He is standing <i>outside</i> . / The book is over <i>there</i> .
Adverbs of Frequency	Show <i>how often</i> an action occurs.	always, often, sometimes, rarely, never	She <i>always</i> arrives on time. / They <i>rarely</i> complain.
Adverbs of Degree	Indicate the <i>intensity</i> or <i>extent</i> of an action or adjective.	very, too, quite, almost, extremely	It was <i>very</i> cold. / He <i>almost</i> won the race.
Adverbs of Reason	Explain <i>why</i> an action occurs.	therefore, thus, because, consequently, hence	He missed the train <i>because</i> he was late. / She was tired, <i>therefore</i> she rested.
